The application for placement will commence after release of KCSE examinations and declaration of programmes, their capacities and costs in various institutions. 8. SCHOOL UNIFORM

Kindly ensure that your child reports to school in correct uniform. Girls' dresses must be loose fitting and fall below their knees. White cotton jalbabs must reach the hips. Only low heeled black school shoes with lace/buckles, white socks and bottle green sweaters and pullovers are allowed.

Boys' trousers must not be tight (piped). Boys may be allowed to put on white Kanzus and prescribed sportswear over the weekend. All pupils must report with at least 3 pairs of labelled uniform. Any other footwear and wrong clothes will be confiscated and donated to orphanages. Only level one short hair will be allowed in school for boys.

5. SCHOOL FEES

No pupil will be allowed in school if they have not cleared arrears and paid 30% of the new term's fees.

TIPS FOR PARENTS

Self Identity.

The period of adolescence generally consists of three overlapping periods. The early period is characterized by bodily changes. This is coupled with acute embarrassment and intensity of feeling that the subject prefers not to be treated as a child.

The middle period is characterized by emotional pressure to establish independence of identity and is open to a lot of influence from peers and social media. A lot of support and monitoring is needed for this phase so that by the time the individual reaches the late period he/ she is a mature young adult, capable of acceptable rational thought.

Teachers and parents ought to monitor the adolescent for the pull from childhood behavior to adulthood. Is the behavior rigid or does it have flexibility and self-control? Are there social support networks? Who are the peers? What feelings, biases does the adolescent exhibit? Can he/she make sober judgments? How is their outlook for the future? Can this person cope with adult thought and are they in control of their actions?

Parents can influence coping mechanisms for these changes by teaching responsibility from an early age. Parents live behavior patterns they want their children to exhibit. These include Tagwa and patience. Moments of contact ought to be there such as eating and praying together during which issues can be freely discussed on give and take basis.

In this forum the emerging adult can verbalise their issue in an acceptable manner. Adolescents ought to be made to realize accurately fact of reaction to situations and their consequences . They need to be able to express their feelings and also listen attentively to objective guidance.

As a family, it is important to inculcate in all members that even in diversity there should be love and conformity to what our religion dictates.

Our advice to parents on how to engage and spend time with their children during this long holiday: 1. It is a wonderful time to spend quality time with your children, eating together, having long talks with them to get to know them better, know what they aspire to be, know what challenges they are going through and help them with your parental wisdom and advice.

2. Draw a plan with them on the day-to-day activities, make sure that there are some three to four hours of studies within a day. Advise them to use the morning hours (9am to 12:30pm). They should study at least 3 subjects during that time every day except Sunday.

3. Some other days let them do past exam's question papers.

4. Afternoons could be spent playing indoor game, and at 4 pm, they could go to play outdoor games for boys, and girls could just go walking with you, (the) parents. It would be fun, trust me.

5. If the home study routine doesn't work for your child, then enroll him/her for tuition

6. I don't advise sleepovers and unsupervised visits to friends' houses.

7. A parent MUST know the company his/her her child is keeping or hanging around with. Strive to be involved in your child's life.

8. Please monitor the use of phones, iPads, tablets, games and television. This should be used with

guidance. 9. Make time to visit relatives, in the Prophets traditions, keeping ties of kinship blesses our provision and life.

10. Pray together, a mother with the girls, while the father should go to the masjid with the boys.

11. Develop a morning routine where after fair you all sit after Swalat and recite Quran together and also do recite the morning athkar as a family, this breeds unimaginable family love and blessings.
