#### 3. PROHIBITED ITEMS

Students will be examined in Mathematics, English, Kiswahili and Integrated Science/Social Studies.

STEM and Social Sciences Pathways will be offered according to the strength and interest of the learner. STEM Subjects to be offered include Advanced Mathematics, Chemistry, Biology and Physics.

## TIPS FOR PARENTS

Students are reporting home for August holidays (about 3 weeks). This is an opportunity to bond, nurture and support your child in their growth and progress in their learning.

Ensure that the child spends about two hours daily studying as this ought to be a working holiday and enhancing mastery of content is key.

Exposure to Cellphones and other non-academic media should be strictly controlled. There is a danger that a student who has overused open digital content will lose concentration for studying print material. This is a minor disadvantage compared to the child being exposed to 'dirty' content readily available at the touch of a button.

Mentorship by different professionals ought to be organised by parents. For example, a child desiring to become a scientist would be more focused on their choice career if they visit such a professional and learn what the job entails and how the mentor managed to get there.

A focused student works better on a defined purpose hence mentorship is key to Identifying a purpose for the student to work hard based on the viewpoint, "This is how I managed to reach this level. You too can do it."
