SCHOOL UNIFORM

HOLIDAY TIPS FOR PARENTS

A school visit should be organized strictly through an appointment at a convenient time during the first two weeks of the next term.

You must also find out the working habits of your child/ward. This includes the study schedule that they follow study habits such as intensive reading for 20-30 minutes session, writing brief notes, attempting questions topic wise and a few guidelines on studying effectively. Given the demands of our curriculum it is important for your child to have a working holiday. This means they must have some time to interact with their studies. Any supplementary materials should be purchased with guidance of the teacher. Some web generated notes and papers may be ineffective or irrelevant.
