FROM THE SCHOOL DIRECTOR'S DESK

Dear Parents, Guardians, Learners, and the School Community,

As we come to the end of Term II, we begin by thanking **Allah (SWT)** for His guidance, protection, and countless blessings throughout the term. Despite the many challenges we encountered, His mercy enabled us to complete the term safely and successfully. We have also observed a worrying increase in the use and possession of **electronic vaping devices (vapes)** among some learners. These devices are illegal for school-going children and pose serious health and disciplinary concerns. Several vapes were confiscated during the term, and appropriate disciplinary measures were taken in accordance with the school's code of conduct.

We respectfully urge parents to remain vigilant and actively involved in their children's lives. Many of the behaviours we are dealing with at school often have their roots outside the school environment. Our learners are at a critical stage of development and require close supervision, consistent guidance, and positive role models both at home and at school. Together, we can nurture responsible, disciplined, and morally upright young people.

Being a relatively long term, we recognised that learners could experience fatigue and boredom. To maintain their motivation and well-being, the school organised a variety of co-curricular, trips and recreational activities that provided opportunities for relaxation, talent development, and social interaction while complementing the academic programme. We appreciate the enthusiasm with which our learners participated in these activities.

As we look ahead to **Term III**, we are reminded that it will be one of the most demanding terms of the academic year. Our candidates will be preparing for the national examinations, while all other learners will be working towards their end-of-year examinations. We encourage every learner to remain focused, disciplined, and committed to achieving their academic goals.

As the holiday begins, we wish all our learners a peaceful, enjoyable, and refreshing break. While they deserve time to rest and spend quality moments with their families, we also encourage them not to neglect their studies. Parents Beware,

Term Two Highlights

16 May 2026 – Interschool Arabic Contest

Our school participated in the Interschool Arabic Contest held at Jeffrey Academy and emerged position one overall.

23 May 2026 – STEM CONTEST Light Academy Mombasa

Our school delivered an outstanding performance at the STEM Contest held at Light Academy Mombasa, emerging as the Best School Overall.

The school also achieved top positions in the individual science categories, being recognised as the Best School in Biology, Chemistry, and Physics.

30 & 31 May 2026 – Aga Khan Debate and Public Speaking Competition

Our Debating Club proudly represented the school at the Debate and Public Speaking Competition held at The Aga Khan Academy.

We entered two teams in the debate category and emerged champions, bringing home the Gold Cup Trophy.

In public speaking, Wahida Mangesho was awarded the Second Best Speaker Trophy, while the school was recognised as the Third Best Institution out of 20 participating schools, each represented by several speakers.

Notably, we were the only 8-4-4 school in the competition and participated with only three speakers. Despite this, two of our speakers advanced to the semi finals, with one progressing to the finals.

6 June 2026 – Light Academy Kiswahili and English Contest

Our school was represented by 16 students at the Kiswahili and English Contest held at Light Academy School.

The school emerged 2nd overall with a mean score of 71.2, narrowly behind Light Academy, which secured 1st position with a mean score of 72.0.

In the Kiswahili category, our students delivered an outstanding performance by securing 1st, 2nd, and 3rd positions. The top performers came from Form 4V and Form 4B, highlighting the school's strength in language excellence.

13 June 2026 – Coast Mini Games: U18 Soccer Championship

Our school's U18 Soccer Team delivered an exceptional performance at the Coast Mini Games 2026, showcasing tactical discipline, teamwork, and determination throughout the tournament. The team displayed great resilience and scored crucial goals at key moments, earning a well deserved championship victory.

In the group stage, our team recorded a 2-1 victory against Emaniyaat, a 1-0 victory against Aveon, and a 2-0 victory against Aga Khan.

In the knockout stage, our team secured a 1-0 semi final victory against Memon before emerging victorious in the final with a 1-0 win against Aga Khan, claiming the championship title.

Our top scorer was Yakub Mohamed (3B), who scored 3 goals while playing as a centre back, demonstrating outstanding skill and commitment.

This remarkable achievement brings great pride to our institution and reflects the dedication, discipline, and teamwork of our students.

13 June 2026 -- Code Innovators Festival – Tec Kidz Africa

Our school participated in the Code Innovators Festival organised by Tec Kidz Africa at Khadija Primary School.

Sheikh Khalifa was represented in all four competition categories, with students showcasing creativity, innovation, and technological skills.

The results were as follows:

Robotics – Position 1, Gamification – Position 1, Mobile App Development – Position 2, Website Development A – Position 3, Website Development B – Position 3.

1 July 2026 – Grade 10 Cultural Day

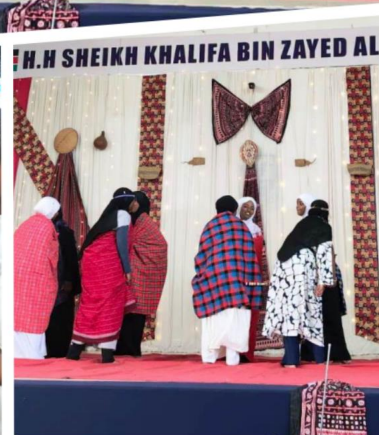
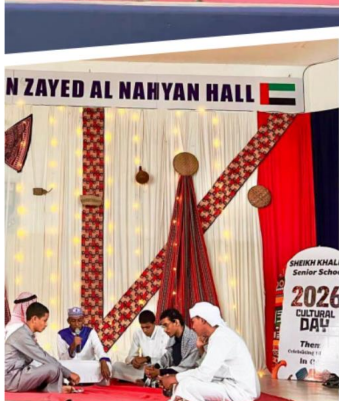
